9 November 2018: A Day in Donana National Park

After two days of miserable weather, Friday 9th November looked a reasonable day, well according to *El Tiempo, a*Spanish weather service. Thus I decided to call my old friend **Luismi** of *AndalusianBirdingHolidays.com* and booked Friday the 9th November for a visit to **Donana NP.**

As we approached the reserve from Isla Major, we came upon our first rice paddies that were being 'churned up' as we

say at home. This was proving a huge magnet for many species of birds as they took advantage of all the food that was now available and of course the raptors overhead looking for potential prey. Birds that were present Grey Plover, Green Sandpiper, Whimbrel, Black-winged Kite, Red Kite, Little Egret Greater Flamingo, Black Stork, Greenshank, Lapwing, Cattle Egret, Great White Egret, White Stork, Glossy Ibis, Black-winged Stilt, Dunlin, Grey Plover, Booted Eagle, and White Waotail.

We then headed into the reserve proper and our first stop was at the **Dehesa de Abaho Visitor Centre**, for a welcome cup of coffee in the café. We then walked down to the laguna which forms the heart of the centre. In the sunshine the brilliant pinks of the **Greater Flamingus** were the highlight of the Laguna.

Also present in and around the laguna were, Common Pochard, Northern Shoveler, Mallard, Teal, Greylag Goose, Coot, Moorhen, Little Grebe, Red-crested Pochard, Common Teal, Great White Egret, Cattle Egret, Glossy Ibis, Little Egret, Kingfisher, Booted Eagle Common Buzzard, Red-legged Partridge, Grey Heron, Black-winged Stilt, Common Kestrel, Avacet and the surprise bird was finding 9 Marbled Teal. It proved to be a very rewarding stop and after a quick walk to the hides which didn't add any new birds to our list, we set off to the second visitor centre of the reserve, where there had been reports of Black-winged Kites and several harriers had also been reported in the vicinity.

Along the way several more species were picked up, Common Linnet, Greenfinch, Zitting Cisticola, Black Redstart, Robin, Little Owl, Sparrowhawk, Night Heron, Marsh Harrier, Greater Cormorant, Common Crane very high overhead, migrating in from the north. We stopped for a 'field lunch', at the Jose Antonio Valverde Centro Visitantes, named after a man whom Luis tells me was the spanish equivalent of David Attenborough. The centre itself had a few birds on the ponds but nothing new. However in and around the centre were several birds of note, i.e. overhead were Hen Harrier, Marsh Harrier, Black-tailed Godwit, Swallows,

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Montagu's Harrier, Red Kite, Black Kite, Bouted Eagle and Black-winged Kite all showing well. Our next stop was a set of disused

Kestrels and we saw at least 30 birds in the area. A number of birds had what looked like satellite wing tags on them as you can see from the picture opposite. Also noted nearby were several Northern Wheatear, Stonechat, Lesser Short-toed Larks, Skylarks, Hooppe, and up in the sky, a tussle between several Marsh Harriers and an immature Spanish Imperial Eagle. You would think it couldn't get any better than this sequence of great birding; well Donana never fails to surprise the visitor. As we were driving along the main road between the reserve and some rice paddies, we

witnessed an almost vertical assault from above of

a **Booted Eagle** on a **Little Egret.** We halted the car as soon as safety allowed and went back to the spot where we had seen the attack happening and sure enough there was the **Booted Eagle** on top of it's victim. We were able to get the car within

10m of the incident and watched for a few minutes as the eagle subdued its prey. It wasn't long before the local **Ravens** turned up to muscle in on the food. The **Common Magpie** didn't miss the event either and soon appeared as well, for any possible 'extras'. The day was getting on and I wanted to see their cousins [a-w magpie] at another location, which was supposed to be a good area to see them as they were used to people. After 15 minutes of hard driving i.e. not stopping if a suspect bird is seen, we reached the site and within minutes we saw the first of at least 50 birds. The **Azure-winged Magpie**, a handsome bird and easy to photograph for once. Also found

at this location was a single Sanderling, Eurasian Spoonbill, Spotless Starling, Iberian Shrike and Grey Plover.


